
In New Mexico, wolves account for less than one-half of one percent of total cattle and calf losses.

Together, mountain lions and bobcats take more than 30 times the cattle and calves than wolves do, but there is no all-out campaign to rid the state of these predators.

Wolves have an insignificant impact to the cattle industry overall, however Defenders recognizes that wolves can and do occasionally have a greater impact on individual ranchers.
